





"How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth!" (Psalm 119:103, NRSV).


Recently I was confronted with this question: If you fed yourself with

The new Toyota Hybrid van arrived in early December, and now we have two hybrid vans to improve the economy of our travel. The new van is a 2025 model.
