





- Stronger craft glue (not hot glue)
- · Star stickers or sequins
- Two 4" x 5" pieces of clear Con-Tact paper
- Scissors; pencil; perm-

What you do:

- In bottom center of can, hammer a hole with a nail. Paint outside of can. Let dry.
- Add glitter and a little water to white glue. With a clean paintbrush, glue tissue paper to bottom outside of lid.
- Add stars to sticky side of Con-Tact paper. Place a matching piece on top, sticky sides together.





Wanting his sons to learn not to judge too quickly, a man sent each, in turn, on a quest to look at a pear tree far away and report what he saw.
