# SUMMER FRUIT PIZZA



Celebrate summer with this tasty dessert pizza, using your favorite summer fruits as the toppings.

**What you need:**

- 1 tube slice-and-bake sugar cookie dough
- Knife
- Round pizza pan
- 8 ounces cream cheese
- $\frac{1}{3}$  cup sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon vanilla
- 2 cups sliced fruit
- Adult help



**What you do:**

1. Cut the dough into slices  $\frac{1}{8}$ -inch thick. Place slices on the pan, overlapping them slightly.
2. Bake at 375 degrees for 12 minutes. Let cool.

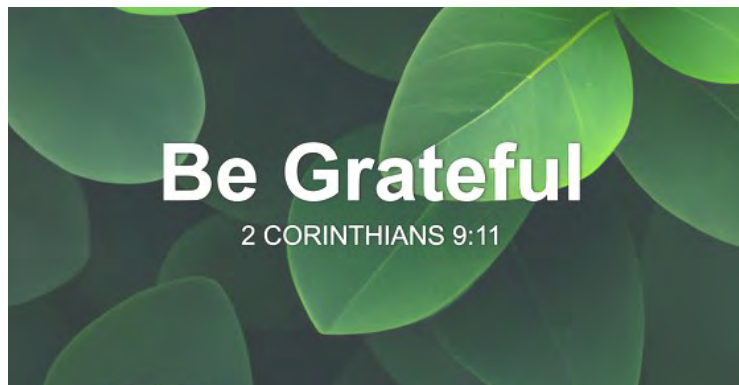

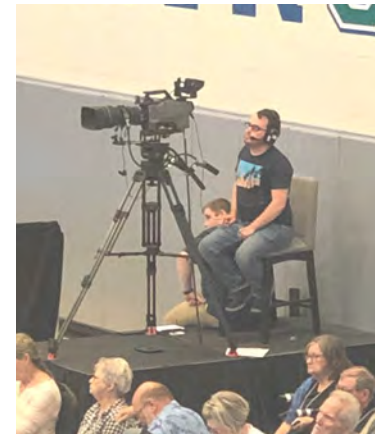

The trip was organized through First Christian Church, an independent church in Somerset, and Baptists On Mission (BOM), an organization supporting many types of ministries including disaster relief.

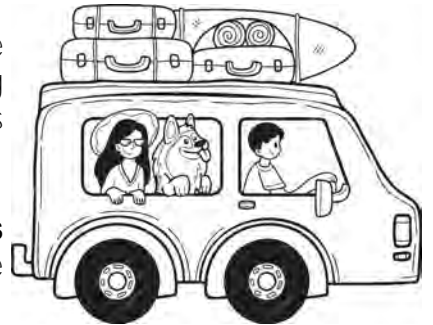
The trip's host center was a renovated nursing home which can house 90 people. The center provided meals and construction supplies on site. From a stack of files listing requested jobs to complete, Gary (center's director) discussed with the team leaders which ones our groups could do. We did ceiling repairs, replaced doors, fixed plumbing, installed flooring, built decks and ramps, and constructed a room addition. 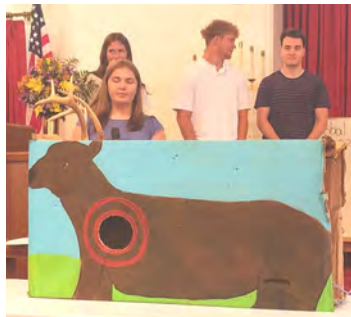

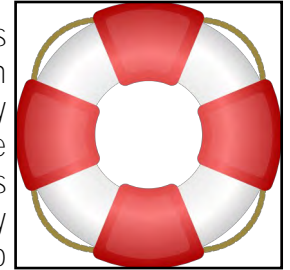

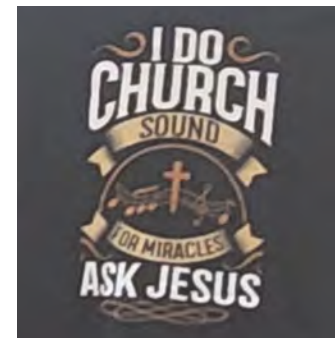
## Be a lifesaver

About 200 people — including 100 lifeguards — attended a pool party in New Orleans in 1985 to celebrate the first summer in memory that no one had drowned at a city pool. At the end of the festivities, the four on-duty lifeguards began clearing the area and found a fully dressed man in the deep end. Despite efforts to revive him, he died.
