Lessons from the angels

To frightened shepherds on the first Christmas Eve, a host of angels sang, “Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men” (Luke 2:14, KJV).

Nineteenth-century minister Charles Kingsley explained how these key words tell the meaning of Jesus’ birth and give meaning to our lives.

- **Glory.** “That little babe, lying in the manger among the cattle, was showing the very highest glory of the great God who had made heaven and earth. To stoop, to condescend, to have mercy, to forgive — that is the highest glory of God.”
- **Peace.** “God is not selfish. He sacrificed himself for us. Sacrifice yourselves then for each other! Give up your own pride, your own selfishness, your own interest for each other, and you will be ... at peace.”
- **Good will.** “God loves you, and He wills to raise you out of this selfish, quarrelsome life of sin, into a loving, brotherly, peaceful life of righteousness. That babe in the manger at Bethlehem is a sign to you and me that God will freely give us that spirit of love if we ask for it.”

Christian symbol ~ Poinsettias



This shrub, native to Mexico, is at the heart of a legend about a poor girl who wanted to bring Baby Jesus a gift one Christmas Eve. As she walked to church, she gathered a bouquet of weeds — which Jesus miraculously transformed into lovely red flowers. Thus the poinsettia (named for Joel Poinsett, the U.S. ambassador to Mexico who first brought the plant to America) is known in Mexico as la flor de la Nochebuena (flower of the Holy Night). The poinsettia is also an ideal Christmas symbol because its leaves turn red when deprived of sunlight, and its flowers (the red inner buds) bloom in December.

P E A C E Wreath



What you need:

- Paint (blue and green)
- Paint brush
- Embroidery hoop
- 24 wooden clothespins
- Scissors
- Craft foam (white, red and green)
- Glue
- 3 white feathers
- Floral wire (two pieces)

What you do:

1. Paint the hoop blue and the clothespins green. When dry, attach clothespins around the hoop.
2. Cut a dove shape (slightly wider than the hoop's diameter) out of white foam. Glue on feathers.
3. Pierce the beak with a scissors tip. Slide a piece of wire through the slit to make an olive branch.
4. From green foam, cut out two leaves. Attach them to each end of the wire.
5. From red foam, cut out the letters P E A C E. Glue them onto clothespins.
6. Place dove in center of hoop. Glue its head and tail to clothespins.
7. Attach wire to the back and hang up your wreath.

Bethlehem's Church of the Nativity, which marks the likely spot of Jesus' birth, has a four-foot-high entrance. Throughout the centuries, the height of the entrance has been lowered twice: once to prevent looting and once to keep out camel- and horse-riders.

Because visitors must bow as they enter, this has become known as the Door of Humility. It's a reminder of the reverent, submissive posture our hearts should take as we approach our newborn Lord and Savior. It's also a reminder that Jesus is the narrow door (Luke 13:24) — the only path to eternal life.

As you worship this Christmas season, whether or not you're physically able to kneel, enter Jesus' presence with a humble and thankful heart. He alone deserves our reverence because He alone is able to save.

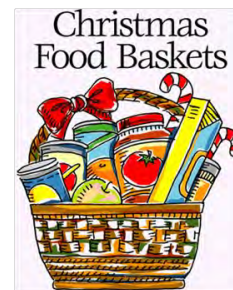

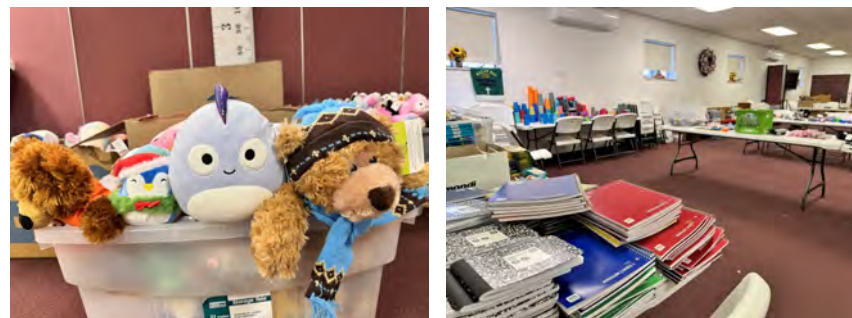

When you read these words from scripture, the last thing many people think about is how God will take a donation and multiply it in more ways than you can imagine. Well, that is exactly what has happened inside the walls of Wesley Chapel. We have been immeasurably blessed with donations that go for various causes outside the walls of Wesley Chapel. As of late, the blessings have been flowing with Shoeboxes packed full of love and kindness, but more importantly...JESUS! Every year I am in awe of how this all comes together for our church to bless those all around the world. After being in Paraguay and seeing the love that poured out of the boxes and flowed through each outreach event, it became more apparent that we need to do more to reach the ends of the earth and spread the Gospel. How do we do this while living in Rockwood? Well, the easy answer is to pack more boxes! When you hear that at one outreach event, 10 boxes that went out into the hands of the children brought back 50 children to the Greatest Journey 12 week program, you can only do one thing, happy dance! These small tangible gifts that we as a church collectively packed are doing far more than we could ever physically see here earthside. A BIG THANK YOU to each person that prayed, donated, helped organize, those who attended the packing party, or those who individually packed a box - you have helped create ABUNDANCE and BLESSINGS. A special thank you to Brooklyn and Faith for helping to pack my car in a windstorm so the boxes were able to go for a short ride to Kingwood before departing to Baltimore, Maryland. On Monday, November 25th, the boxes were loaded onto two pup trucks and prayed over before pulling out to Baltimore. There they will be processed by hundreds of volunteers. The boxes will be covered in prayer and then begin their journey to the child that God has chosen from the start. Some boxes will be received by children within months and others will take a longer journey and may not reach their destination until summer. But each and every box packed and collected will within **the year be distributed to GOD'S Children**. Just last year at this time we were packing and praying over 257 boxes, and with your prayers and

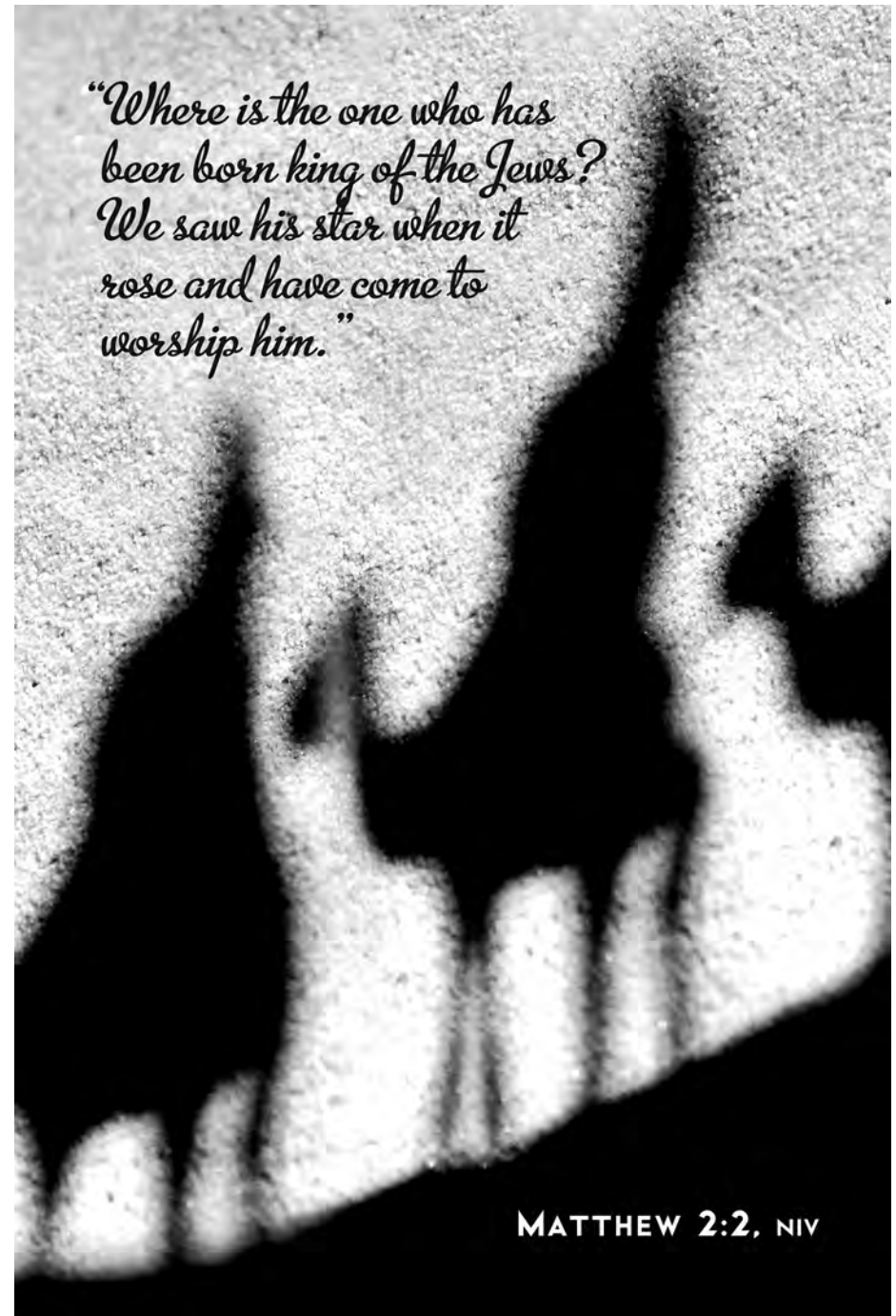

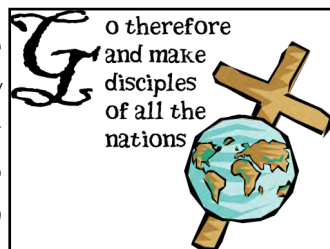
Missionaries Emanuel and Jessica Perez Gormley.
