Christmas traditions around the globe

Although Americans celebrate the holiday with candlelight services, piles of gifts, large feasts, lights and trees, people in other countries mark Jesus' birth in many interesting ways:

- Nine days before Christmas in Mexico, Las Posadas processions reenact Joseph and Mary's search for a place to stay in Bethlehem.
- Instead of decorating trees, Italians place fruit on small wooden pyramids.
- On Christmas Eve, the streets of Caracas, Venezuela, are blocked off so people can roller-skate to church.
- Ukrainian Christmas trees often feature an artificial spider and web. According to a folk tale, a poor woman who couldn't afford decorations awoke one Christmas morning to find that spiders had "trimmed" her children's trees with delicate webs.
- In Brazil, the gift-bringer is known as Papai Noel (Father Noel), who lives in Greenland, according to legend. When he arrives in Brazil, he wears silk clothing because of the summer heat.
- It's considered bad etiquette to send red Christmas cards in Japan because funeral notices are customarily printed in red.






Get bundled up and join Wesley Chapel's Bible Study Group as they go caroling to loved ones around the area. The group had so much fun last year and are looking forward to spreading



Wow! Another year has flown by and before we knew it, it was shoebox packing time! This year empty shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child were distributed in middle October to congregation members to

pack and return by November 16th. Many donations were collected for a church packing party, some items were donated by Center Covenant Brethren Church. On Tuesday evenings during Bible study Flint and Reed Breegle, Hannah Latuch, and Brooklyn Monteith prepped many items for the packing party on November 8th. Both young and old came together to help pack over 200 giftboxes in just a couple of hours. On November 16th Mindy Singo, who is also the Area Coordinator for Somerset County Operation Christmas Child Team, led the congregation in a prayer over the shoeboxes that were present in the sanctuary. The Agape children on Wednesday evening helped Kaitlyn Miller and Mindy Singo load over 284 shoeboxes into their cars and they drove the boxes to Kingwood Fellowship Center where they were unloaded, counted twice, prayed over, then placed in large cartons. With a last minute push to the finish-line, Wesley Chapel Church was able to conquer their goal and ended up with a final total of 310 shoeboxes packed. We beat last year's total by 9. The giftboxes will wait until the final day of collection week which is November 24th. After the boxes are loaded onto the pup trucks, they will be driven to the Baltimore Maryland Processing Center and will be processed before heading to their international location and then onto the distribution events planned around the world. Thank you to everyone that prayed, bought, planned, prepped for the shoeboxes. A huge thank you to everyone that took boxes and packed them within your homes. For everyone that helped in any way, you are the hands and feet doing God's work and are puzzle pieces to help change a child's life. More importantly, you are giving them an opportunity to learn more about Jesus and inviting Him into their hearts.



Rockwood Community Members,

Lazarus Gate Food Pantry has served the greater Rockwood Area since April; 2013. Our distribution site is Messiah Lutheran Church, 144 Jubilee St. Rockwood (News Centerville). Prior to Covid, we served 60-70 families twice a month. Our numbers post Covid average 30-40 families twice a month. We continue to distribute as a drive-thru pantry, the second and fourth Wednesdays of the month (with changes around holidays). Hours of distribution have are 3:30 – 5:00 in the afternoon.

We have been blessed with many volunteers who keep this ministry going. But there is always room for more people to serve. Attached is a list of volunteer positions. I, personally, am thankful for each person who contributes time to make this ministry a success.

Recent budget cuts have had a negative impact on our ministry. More people are feeling a need to visit food pantries, SNAP benefits have been reduced and in some cases have disappeared. The selection of foods available has been reduced and the price has gone up. Local businesses are not donating as much as they have in the past, some not donating at all. Local farmers are no longer paid to provide fresh produce, milk, and meat to pantries. Times are extremely uncertain times.

How can you help? First pray for this feeding ministry and the people we serve. And pray that the people making decisions that affect feeding ministries, might support more funding. I encourage you to contact our elected officials, asking for more support and sharing any stories surrounding food insecurity that you might have I am suggesting a monthly donation drive. I have included that information. Monetary donations are always appreciated. Presently, we have monies. But with the uncertainty, we worry how long our monies will last. I encourage you to visit our food pantry to see how we operate and then decide if there is a way you could help.


