

Food Crisis

The food situation is expected to be critical in Malawi. Between October 2024 to March 2025, 5.7 million faced acute food insecurity. Severe malnutrition rose by 21% from 1,649 in February 2024, to 5,076 in February 2025. These are the most areas of our focused outreaches. We trust the Lord to buy food items in bulk and store for the orphanage and the people we reach out to. WE NEED TO BUY FOOD NOW.



Housing the Homeless

Natural disasters, poverty, rural-urban immigration all influence Malawi's homeless situation. According to the world bank, approx. 70% of Malawi's population live below 2.15 USD international poverty line. The hardest hit are the elderly, widows, orphans, and the disabled. With 1,700 USD we can put up a decent habitable house. A few need to be built this year.

People Living with Disabilities


People living with disabilities in Malawi face employment barriers, health care challenges, social stigma/discrimination, physical accessibility, and lack of support services. With your thoughts, prayers and financial support CMC (Compassionate Mission Center) steps in to alleviate all these. We are sending children to school after successful medical operations, providing wheel chairs and empowering some in small business.

Clean, Safe Water

Seven million Malawians lack access to basic drinking water. Over 4 million people rely on contaminated water sources, increasing the risk of waterborne diseases. 20% of the population lack access to improved water sources forcing them to use unprotected wells, puddles, or gullies. Diarrhea, cholera, dysentery, and other diseases are prevalent due to contaminated water. We can do more to prevent all these—would you consider helping drill a new bore hole and repair broken ones?

Make this fun snack for a summer picnic — and hope these ants are the only insects around!





**What you need:**



### 2025-2026 Crusades Launched on Easter

Many rural communities in Malawi lack access to the Gospel of Jesus Christ, making it essential to target these areas with evangelism and discipleship initiatives. Collaborating with local churches and organizations does help **amplify the impact of Gospel outreach efforts. Malawi's rural population is** approximately 17.1 million, which accounts for 80.2% of the population. The rural population is steadily growing.

Our recent crusade in Ntcheu witnessed the preaching of His love with the sick, the demon possessed, and the troubled being set free. We prayed also for the baptism and infilling of the Holy Spirit for the people. The power of His resurrection touched them all.

### Eleventh Hour Pastors & Leaders Institute

The harvest is so ripe but the laborers are few. We must train, empower workers in ministry. Providing training and resources for local believers and churches does empower them to share the Gospel effectively. We are inviting ministers, with a passion for both short and long term mission trips, to come to Malawi and help us train laymen, pastors, etc for ministry.

### Orphanage

The Lord had to really speak to us to go for **the launching of this year's Crusades during Easter.** Going there meant we were using our money for the Orphanage. We went there trusting HE spoke to us. "What's special for Easter at the Orphanage?" one brother asked. "Memorizing verses," I told him. "Prepare a special big meal for them, including chocolate!" he said. That was it! Easter Monday—a great special breakfast and the center went ecstatic. Jesus is Lord!



### 90% of Population, No Electricity

With the population of 22,064,883 people, Malawi's electrification rate stands at around 10% with translates to approximately 2.2 million people with access to electricity. About 19.8 million people (90 % of the population) lack access to electricity.


## Use All Your Strength

His father answered, "If you use all your strength, I am sure you can do it."




# FAITH NIGHT AT PNC PARK
