Responding to the Wind

As the people **of GOD, we are made to express kindness through the Spirit's leading and working, gentleness, goodness, faithfulness, and yes, even self-control.** The reality is self-control does not come from ourselves. 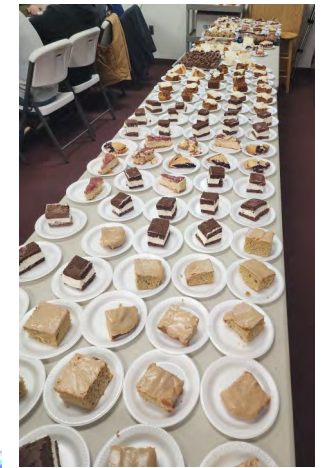

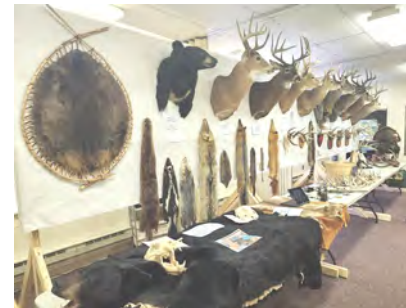

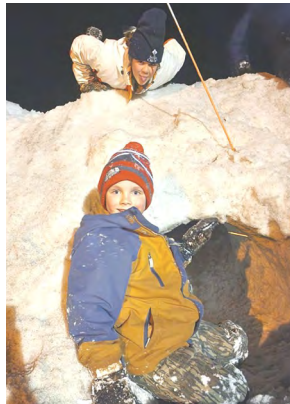

What about Ash Wednesday?

Ash Wednesday will be on March 5th this year. Do you know the symbolism of the day?

1. From ancient times, ashes have been used as a symbol of mourning, penitence, grief and humiliation. In his pain and sorrow, Job "sat among the ashes" (Job 2:8). The Old Testament book of Numbers and the New Testament book of Hebrews indicate that ashes were also used for purification (see Numbers 19:17 and Hebrews 9:13).
2. Christians have had an old tradition of using ashes made from the palm branches used on the last Palm Sunday. Priests and ministers have often used the ashes to make the sign of the cross on a believer's forehead as part of the Ash Wednesday ceremony.
3. The ashes symbolize the Christian's intent to repent of sins, to accept purification from the Lord, and to make a public witness of one's faith in Christ as Lord and Savior.
4. Since Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent, the ashes symbolize one's intention to deepen his or her spiritual life. Lent is a time for spiritual renewal and growth in dedication and service.

450 Homes Lit Up!

With the help of Let There Be Light International, 450 solar lights were distributed to 450 homes that house an average of 7 people. There are families that cannot afford candles or batteries for a torch to light up their **homes at night. A testimony from a local woman, "My life, family, is at the verge of transforming with this light. My small evening business is going to blossom. My children will spend more time in study...the little which was used to light my home is going to be saved, making me more empowered."**

Feeding the Hungry

Thank God for the governments, politicians who feed the hungry. But it is the duty of the church to take care of the hunger stricken people. Tons of food items such as corn, rice, beans, sugar, cooking oil, and fish were donated in 2024. These children shown to the right spent days without food. Between now and May we are in dire need of food to provide our people.



Housing the Homeless

Due to several cyclones in Malawi, my people do not have habitable places to live in. In 2024 we managed to build 9 houses for the homeless, the elderly, the orphans, and those with disabilities. We also repaired 7 houses. Please continue to pray as many more families need habitable houses.

People Living with Disabilities



With your help, we sent 650 children with disabilities to Beit Cure International. We donated 13 wheel chairs, 3 pairs of crutches, 5 pairs of eye glasses, and 3 artificial limbs. One child was transported as far as 700 kilometers one way. Many of these are on their way to a full recovery.

Compassionate News from the Compassionate Mission Center

Malawi, C. Africa
January 2025

From November 28, 2024, to January 1, 2025, we did crusades and charity daily. We had a total of 43 Gospel outreach crusades, resulting in 25 church clusters starting. An estimated number of 7,500 people were won to Christ. One story is of a girl whom the devil was using to cast evil spells on people and they would die. She came to disrupt our meetings. If Satan had known, he should not have sent her. She was powerfully set free. Totally delivered, under the power of the Holy Ghost.

Eleventh Hour Pastors & Leaders Institute

Most leaders we minister with in the villages have never had social or Theological/Biblical trainings. They have a passion for the Lord and His people. We had 670 pastors, lay preachers (including women) trained in 2024. Pray with us for resources to increase these trainings within the communities. Basic materials and books are needed to have people trained so their work blossoms. The people they lead stay in the WORD.

A Home For All (CMC Orphanage)



As we are coming to the end of 2024, we had 89 residential orphaned children at our orphanage, deemed as a Home For All. We simply accommodate those in transit to hospitals or even those who need shelter on both short or long terms.

Apart from these at the center, we also have orphaned children in their villages whom we take care of. Because of space, we could not reach out to them to stay physically with us. As the Lord expands us, we plan to take them too on board.

We were honored by the Lord to have 3 graduates in 2024. Two finished nursing courses and the other a teacher. The youngest at the center is 5 years old and the oldest is 22. The children attend schools from

nursery to college. With the rising costs of food items, we need to continue **trusting the Father's provisions and daily basic needs for our children.** (Street orphaned boy top-left)
