



What you need:


- A large round bowl



Back in March I, along with Kaylie and her husband, Creed, decided to throw our names into a pool to see if we could get picked to be background extras on the set of our favorite show, The Chosen. If you have never heard of this show, it's a historical drama that portravs the life of Jesus and His disciples. I got the text sitting in Bible study that we got chosen, and we were going to be heading to Texas in August. Soon, we started working on our costumes and were transformed into a first-century Jewish family. Once we arrived our schedule was similar both days that we had to be on set in Midlothian, TX. On Aug. 5th and 6th we had to be in costume, ready to go, by 7:00 a.m. There were 600 "extras" which they split up into groups. While we were on set, they gave tours of the sound stage that housed Phoebe's, Caiphus', and Pilot's houses. On Tuesday we were in "Jerusalem" very little, but on Wednesday, we had two hours in "Jerusalem" in 107 -degree weather. The next season of *The Chosen* will be the 24 hours before Jesus' death. So in our scene we were in a large crowd that had not yet turned on Jesus but were watching intently before one of His trials (I can't give too much away). All 600 extras filmed the same scene throughout the day. So there is a very good chance that we will not be on the big screen, but that's ok. We were so blessed to be a part of something that we love. We met people from all over the world who spoke openly on how much they love God, and they shared the same excitement that we had. There are two more seasons to film. and we are hoping to experience this one more time.


SAVE THE DATE: PASTOR APPRECIATION DINNER
